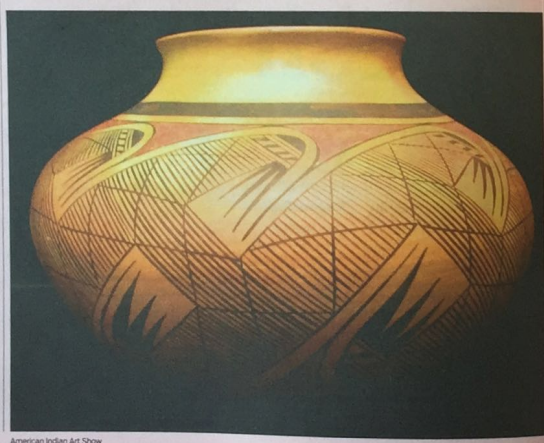
**FILM**
